General Information:

The Math Corps at CSU Summer Camp is a six-week mathematics enrichment and mentoring program for middle and high school students who live and/or attend school in the greater-Cleveland area. The program, which this year will run from **June 18th – July 27th**, brings middle and high school students together with college students and mathematicians, to share in the teaching and learning of mathematics, in a university setting.

The Summer Camp serves students who, in the fall, will be entering the 7th or 8th grade. High school students entering the 10th, 11th, or 12th grade serve as paid Teaching Assistants (TAs).

The 7th and 8th grade students receive instruction from University faculty and enjoy a variety of learning activities led by the college and high school students under the supervision of middle and high school teachers. The high school TAs serve as role models and “big brothers” or “big sisters” for the younger kids and engage in their own learning as well studying both fundamental and advanced mathematics.

Students accepted into the program receive:

- a light breakfast daily
- lunch every Thursday
- school supplies
- a calculator (in their 1st year of the program)
- bus tickets, if needed
- a Math Corps t-shirt
- access to CSU facilities such as libraries and computer labs

Schedule:

Students in the program are expected to **attend on time and fully all program days** listed below:

Camp Dates: Monday - Thursday, June 18 – July 26

NO CAMP Wednesday, July 4 – Friday, July 6

Camp Hours: 9:30am – 2:30pm middle school students

9:00am – 3:30pm high school students

Registration and Orientation: Thursday, June 7th at 6:30pm

TA Training: (high school students only) June 5th – 8th, Tuesday – Friday, 9:00am – 1:30pm

Optional Fridays: Friday sessions, featuring special activities will be offered each week.

Weeks 1, 2, 4 & 5, 9:30am – 12:30pm

Attendance on Friday is optional.

Closing Ceremonies: Friday, July 27th* at 6:30pm **please note: we do not meet for camp on this date*

Tuition: Tuition is free for all middle school students thanks to the support of Cleveland State University and the generous contributions of foundations, corporations and individuals.

High School Teaching Assistantships: Teaching Assistants (TAs) are paid stipends ranging from \$500 to \$850. The rate of pay depends on the student’s previous work, if any, in the Math Corps and on his/her level of accomplishment in mathematics.

IMPORTANT: Students need to submit a copy of their most recent report card with their application. If submitting electronically, screenshots or pictures are acceptable, but **MUST** include the student’s name, all current classes with grades, attendance and GPA.

Schools or teachers may submit their students’ applications as a group.

Application Deadline:

Applications will be accepted until 5:00 p.m. on **Friday, April 6th** or until all spots are filled.

Returning Math Corps students will receive priority consideration provided their application is received by 5:00pm on **Friday, February 16th**.

Students will be notified of a decision on their application by **Friday, April 27th**.

POLICIES AND EXPECTATIONS

The Math Corps at CSU stands on the belief that all children have a unique and special greatness within them, and that through hard work and the support of a caring family or community – that greatness can be realized.

In keeping with the Math Corps’ determination to help each and every one of its students find his or her own greatness, we ask that the following policies and expectations be observed:

1. **All students are expected to attend the program every day, in accordance with the program schedule.** An absence caused by illness, family emergency, or other unforeseen and unavoidable event may be excused, if prompt notification of the circumstances is given to the Program Coordinator. The Program Coordinator has sole authority for deciding whether any absence should be excused or not. Family vacations, reunions, and other similar outings conflict with the program’s goals, and so will not be seen as reasons to excuse an absence. **Any unexcused absence is grounds for dismissal.**
2. **All students must be on time every day.** An incident of lateness caused by an unforeseen and unavoidable event may be excused, if prompt notification of the circumstances is given to the Program Coordinator. The Program Coordinator has sole authority for deciding whether any lateness should be excused or not. **Any unexcused lateness is grounds for dismissal.**
3. **All homework assignments are expected to be completed and turned in on time. Failure to complete assignments as required is grounds for dismissal.**
4. **All participants are to treat each other with respect and courtesy and are to maintain proper behavior at all times, consistent with being part of a university program. Behavior that fails to meet the standards of the Math Corps at CSU is grounds for dismissal.**
